### What makes the Aachen Pilgrimage unique?

Since its very beginnings the pilgrimage, held every seven years since 1349, has been a special experience for pilgrims from around the world. And significantly more than that. It has been a space for spirituality, an occasion for cultural exchange and a wellspring for Aachen's links to the world. And it was always a space for discourse, for social reflection and even a place of protest against National Socialism. The Aachen Pilgrimage was always more than the veneration of relics dating back more than a thousand years. To this day, it still is.

# What relics will pilgrims be coming to see?

The magnificent Shrine of St. Mary in Aachen Cathedral houses four cloth relics that are removed for the duration of the pilgrimage only once every seven years. For ten days they are displayed to pilgrims and venerated in numerous services. The relics are ancient cloths. Tradition has it that they are St. Mary's robe, Jesus' swaddling clothes, St. John the Baptist's beheading cloth and Jesus' loincloth.

In nearby Kornelimünster the apron cloth worn by Jesus at the Last Supper, his Sudarium and his shroud will be displayed over the same period.

It is said that Charlemagne received the seven relics as a gift from Jerusalem in 799 to consecrate his palatinate church – today's Aachen Cathedral. In 814 Charlemagne's son gave three of the relics to the newly-founded Imperial Abbey of Kornelimünster.
